From 1930 until her death in 1986, she was active in the struggle for human and civil rights, best known for her influence on the young leaders of the Student Nonviolent Coordinating Committee (SNCC). She rarely sought the spotlight, but was a mentor and teacher to many. Indefinite hunger strikes begin at Pelican Bay and other Miss Baker acquired the nickname "Fundi," a Swahili word meaning someone who teaches a craft to the next generation. Her prisons throught craft was empowering those around her to dream big while staying rooted in resilient communities struggling for freedom.
