Japanese American activists expanded the discussion to connect the slavery, genocide and conquest of early colonialism, with the collective punishment of internment in WWII concentration camps. 110,000 Japanese Americans were imprisoned in these camps beginning in 1942 in an atmosphere of racist war hysteria.</i></p>
